TO HOPE AND ACT WITH CREATION

SEASON OF CREATION 2024

In recent years, many Christian churches have begun celebrating the "Season of Creation," September 1 – October 4. Christians across denominations and around the world are invited to pray and care for creation. September 1 was declared as a World Day of Prayer for Creation for the Eastern Orthodox Church in 1989. It was embraced by other European churches in 2001, and by the Roman Catholic Church in 2015. Since 2016, the World Council of Churches and many others have collaborated in an ecumenical celebration of the Season of Creation.

For the second year, the UCC is conducting a nationwide Climate Hope campaign. In 2023, nearly 8,000 postcards urging strong environmental protections were collected from 143 churches, Conferences, and camps and delivered to the EPA. This year's campaign, Vote for Climate Hope, invites voters to make "a sacred commitment to a more just and equitable world for people of all ages, races, and walks of life." I hope you will join us this month in celebrating the Season of Creation and that you will consider taking the Climate Hope Voter Pledge, committing "to vote as an act of hope for present and future generations."

OCWM Offering – Sunday, September 8

The OCWM Offering provides funding for the work of UCC Conferences and for the work of the UCC's national ministries. Congregations send their OCWM gifts to the Conference. Each Conference then decides what percentage of those gifts to keep for the work within that Conference, and what percentage it will send to the

national setting of the UCC. Some of the National Basic Support money is used for ministries to Conferences, local churches and members, as well as for ecumenical, prophetic and missionary ministries on behalf of the UCC. Contributions from individuals to their congregations comprise the funds from which OCWM Basic Support is given to the Conferences and national ministries.

Climate Hope

The care of God's creation is a central calling of Christians and has found unique expression in the life of the United Church of Christ. Leaders from the UCC were integral to the launch of the environmental justice movement in the 1980s with its pioneering focus on environmental racism. Through General Synod resolutions, we have repeatedly stepped forward to lead the way as people of faith on critical climate matters. Today, congregations throughout the country have answered the call to tend God's creation by becoming Creation Justice Churches. People are more likely to vote when they make a commitment to others to vote. The climate crisis is deeply motivating for many potential voters. To put our values and vision into practice, the UCC is conducting a Vote for Climate Hope campaign in 2024. Between now and November 1st, UCC churches from across the country are collecting Climate Hope Voter Pledge Cards. Those who pledge to vote will receive a confirmation email with helpful voter information; a one-time reminder of their pledge to vote in the week before the election; and a chance to win one of ten Vote for Climate Hope tumblers featuring the artwork from our 2024 Climate Hope Art Contest for children and youth.
